Carteret County Confirmed COVID-19 Cases Current as of 12/11/2020, 3:00 pm

Carteret County has 2,287 confirmed COVID-19 cases as of December 11, 2020 at 3:00 pm. Of the 2,287 confirmed COVID-19 cases, 1,887 cases have fulfilled the CDC’s isolation requirements and are considered “recovered.” This means 378 cases are considered “active” and are still in isolation. In Carteret County, there have been 22 deaths associated with COVID-19. There are 10 COVID-19 patients currently hospitalized at Carteret Health Care.

Carteret County residents are encouraged to use reputable sources of information to learn more about COVID-19. Reputable sources of information include the Carteret County Government, NC Department of Health and Human Services (NC DHHS), and Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) websites.

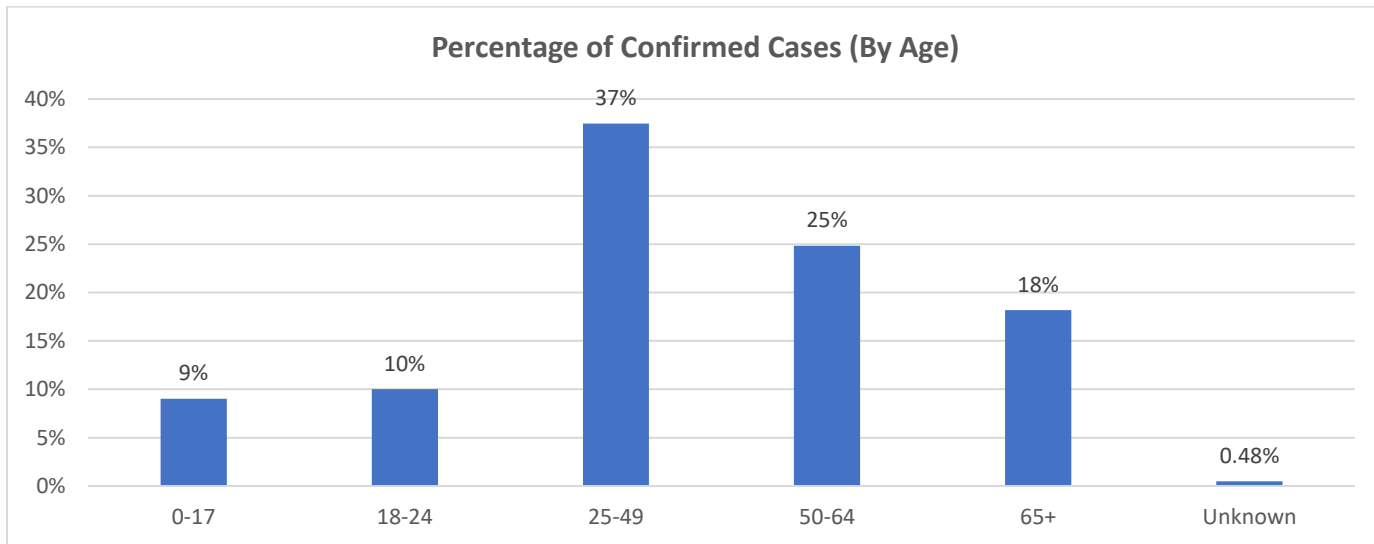

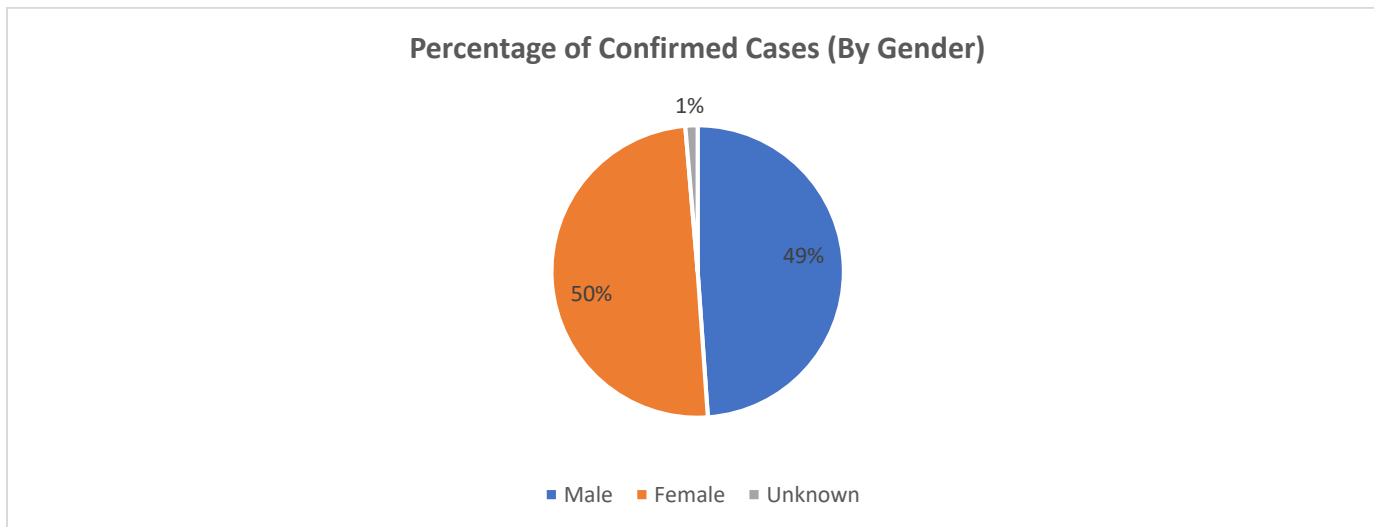

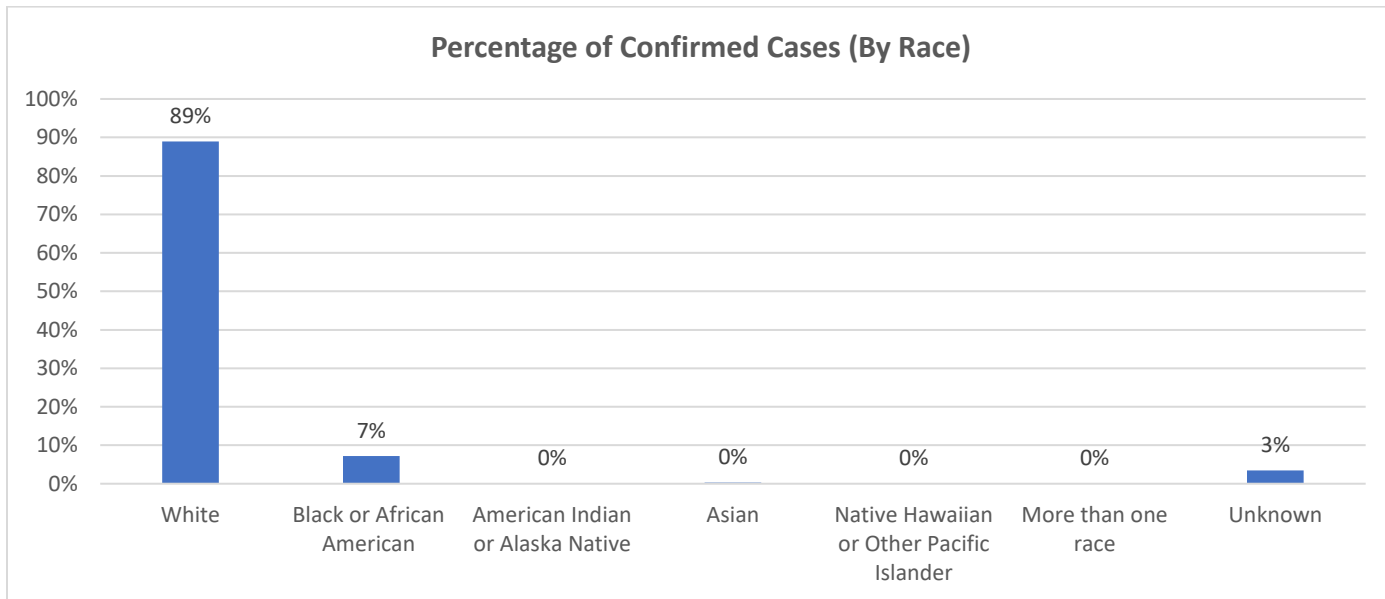

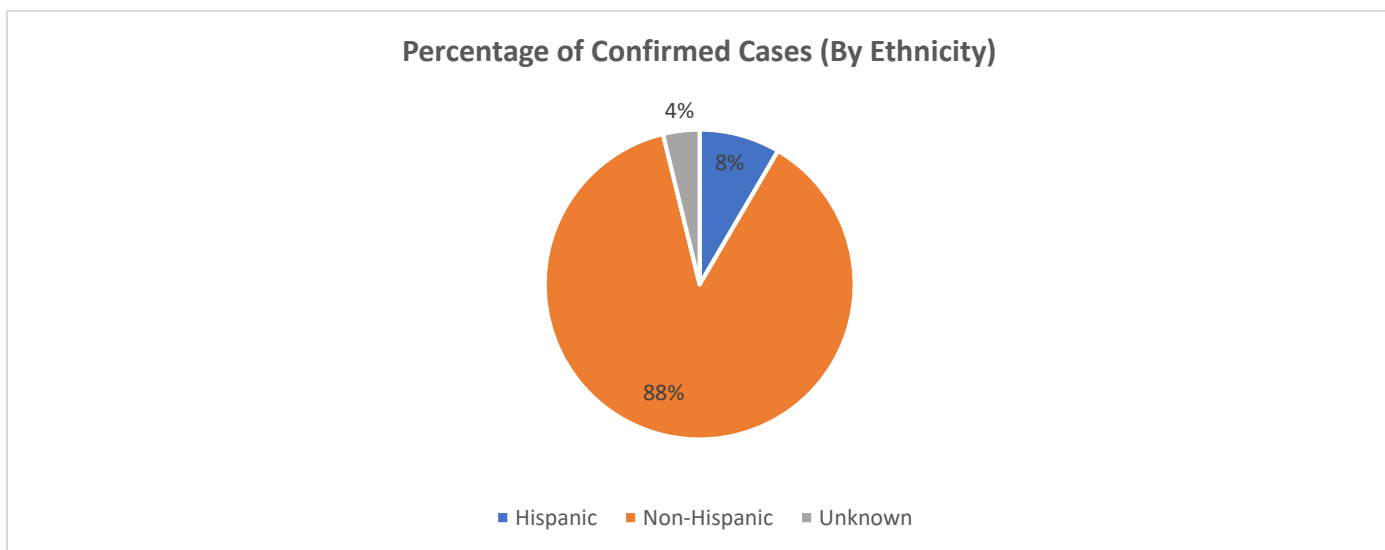

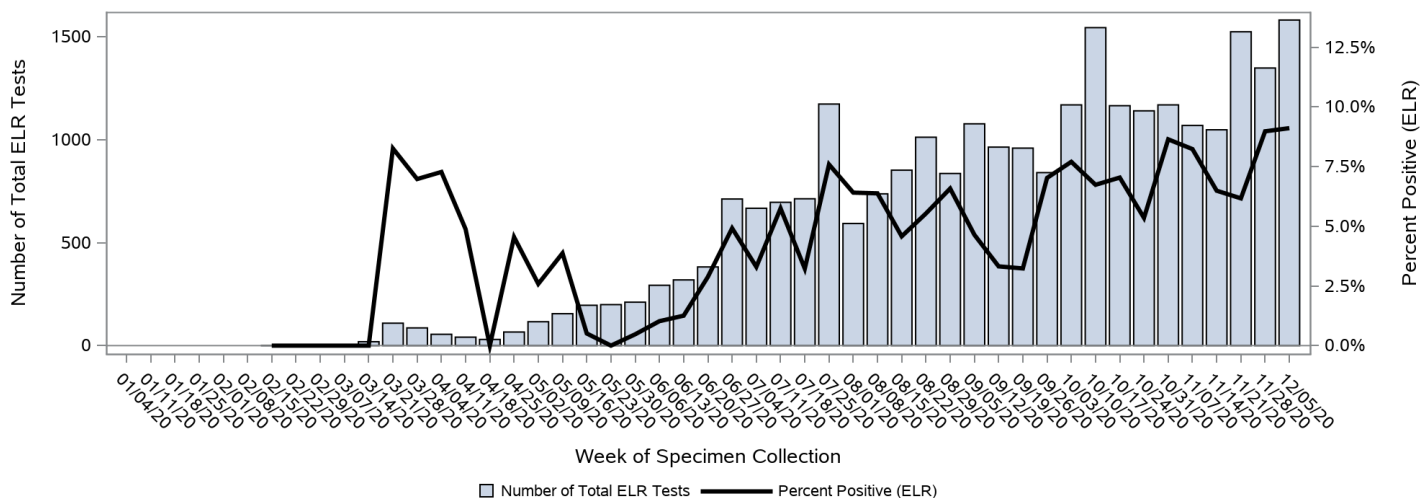

Percent Positive/Estimated Total Tests Completed for Carteret County

This NC Department of Health and Human Services chart/graph shows the percent of positive tests as a proportion of total ELR tests. We know that as testing increases, the number of cases can climb. This gives us an idea of the number of cases with respect to the amount of testing being done. This is only calculated using results from labs that report electronically into the state system (e.g. NC State Lab of Public Health, LabCorp, Carolinas Medical System (Atrium Health), Duke, UNC, Vidant, Novant, Mission Hospital, Quest Atlanta, Quest New England, Quest Tampa, Quest West Hills, and Mako). New labs are continuously being onboarded for ELR. Thus, this information may not be representative of tests in Carteret County that are being done by labs not reporting electronically.
